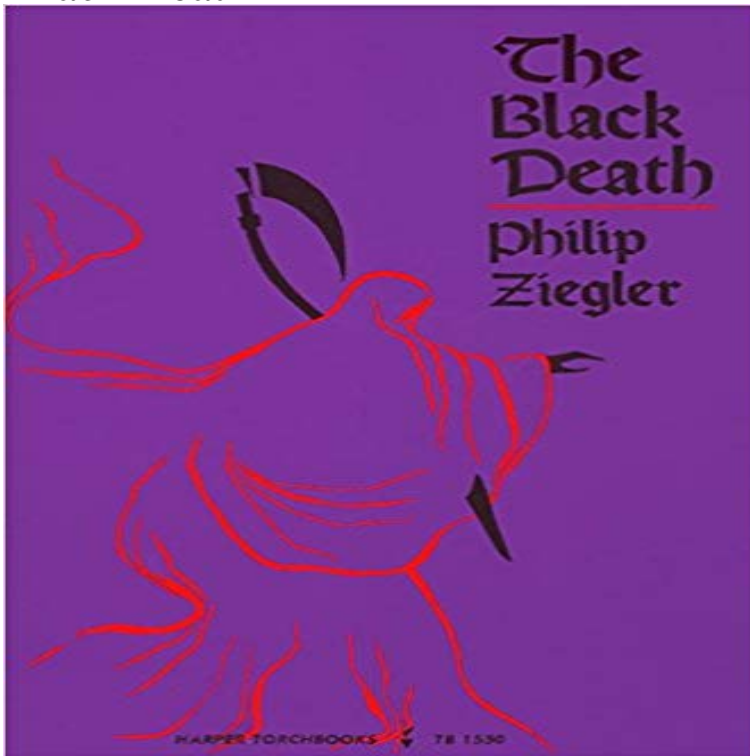


Black Death
