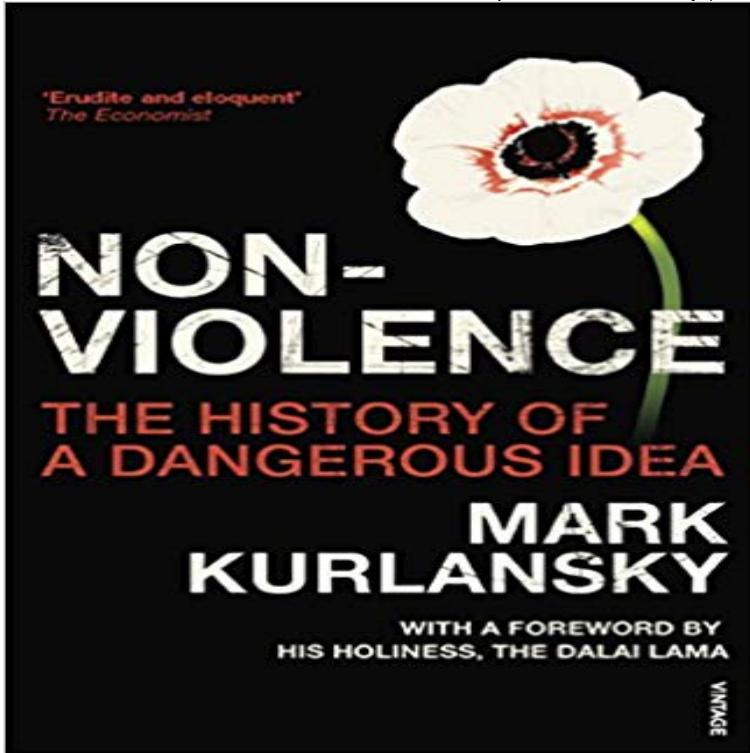


Nonviolence: The History of a Dangerous Idea
