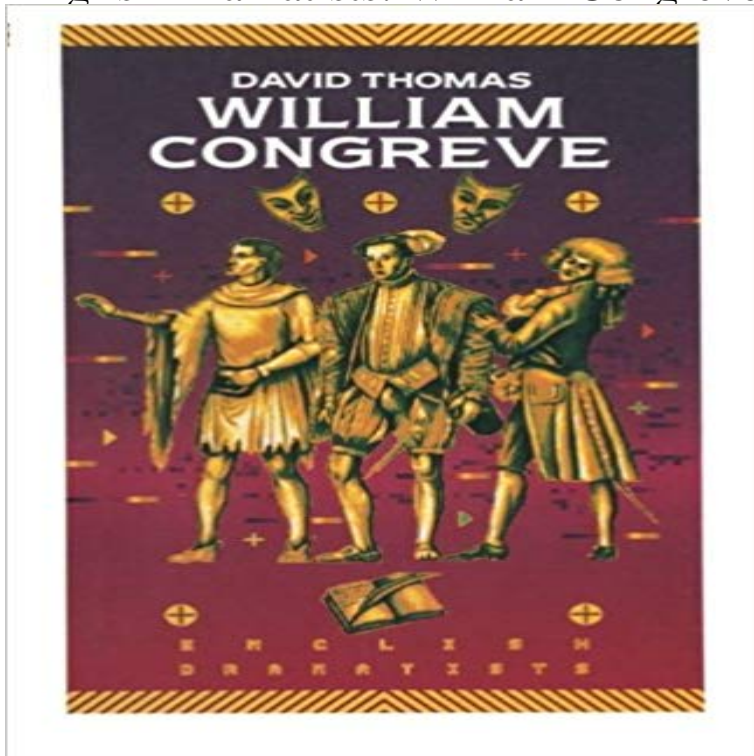


English Dramatists: William Congreve
